(An unforgiving servant)

Peter was puzzled. He heard Jesus talking about forgiving one another.

So he asked,
'When my brother or sister does
something nasty to me,
how many times

Is it seven times?'

Jesus replied, 'Not just seven times but four hundred and ninety times.'

He grabbed hold of him, and said, 'Pay me back the money you owe.'


'Please wait,'
