'Anyone who tries to make himself great will be humbled. The person who is humble will be made great.'


Jesus also said, 'When you have a party, don't just invite those who will invite you back. Include those who can't invite you. Live for what God will give you when He takes you to heaven.'

A third man said, 'I have just got married. I cannot come.'




The servant went home and told his master saying, 'None of your guests can come. All of them want to be excused.'
